**NAVY FEDERAL CREDIT UNION DONATES \$250,000 TO FCUL HURRICANE  
RELIEF FUND**

Tallahassee—The Florida Credit Union League's Hurricane Relief Fund has received a major boost to its Hurricane Relief Fund, established to assist credit union employees and volunteers that have suffered as a result of four major hurricanes that have struck the state. Navy Federal Credit Union, whose headquarters is located in Virginia, has donated \$250,000 to supplement FCUL's efforts to assist hurricane victims.

Navy Federal has nine branch offices and a remote call center located in Florida. A number of its employees suffered damage from the hurricanes; most of the damage occurred in the Pensacola area as a result of Hurricane Ivan. This is the credit union's second major donation to the Relief Fund; its first \$10,000 donation was made in September.

"This donation is made on behalf of the more than 450 Navy Federal employees living in Florida, many of whom personally experienced losses during this hurricane season. We are grateful for all the support the Florida Credit Union League and the Foundation provided to our staff," said Brian McDonnell, President/CEO.

FCUL President/CEO welcomed the additional funds contributed by Navy Federal. "This very generous donation made by Navy Federal is very timely," said Guy Hood. "The Hurricane Relief Fund can now provide an even bigger impact to assist those in the credit union family here in Florida that have suffered. We thank Navy Federal for helping us in this time of crisis."

With the Navy Federal contribution, as well as others received since last week, the FCUL Hurricane Relief Fund has now raised a total of \$732,171.
